The City of Clairton is a small city in Allegheny County located along the Monogahela River. The population is 6,700. It's nickname is The City of Prayer.

Clairton is the home of Clairton Works, which is the largest coke manufacturing facility in the United States.

The city was founded just after the turn of the 20th century when the Crucible Steel Company acquired a large tract of land along the west side of the Monogahela River about 13 miles south of Pittsburgh.

Today, Clairton boasts the Clairton Bears and its championship football teams. A recent Clairton High School graduate, Tyler Boyd, now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals.
